### A PEEK INSIDE THE PRIDE

In June of 1991, Carl and I ran an event called a Grand Classic for the Classic Car Club of America and met Jerry and Kathy Nell. They were already in the planning stages for the 1995 Biennial Jaguar national event to be held in Milwaukee by the WI Region and wanted Carl and I to join the club and help them with the event. When we said we didn't even own a Jaguar, Jerry said "That is okay, you can drive one of ours!" Little did we know how much that initial meeting would change and enrich our lives.

For the 1995 event, we still did not own a Jaguar and instead we drove and showed Jerry and Kathy's 1974 Jaguar E-type roadster (now owned by members Bruce and Maria Tammi). In fact we would go on to run many events with the Nell's including the 2001 Biennial.

For years afterward we were searching for an older Jaguar that would meet our needs as a "dual purpose" car because of our involvement in the Classic Car Club of America (CCCA) which celebrates cars from 1915-1948. In 1995 after traveling home with Jerry and Kathy from the Meadowbrook

Concours there was an ad in The Special Breed about a 1948 Jaguar 3.5 ltr saloon available for sale in Oshkosh WI. Wow! Could it be that simple? Quickly we reached out and learned his wife was willing to sell the car only because they were in negotiation to buy a drop head of the same year. Discussion ensued for the next 9 months waiting for Wally to call to let us know they had finally purchased the drop head and the saloon was now available for sale. Finally we took position of our "50 foot car" because it looked good from 50 feet away.....up close, much. not so



Despite being stored in a garage for several years AND the engine compartment filled with hickory nuts, the car ran well and for years, we drove it to both CCCA and Jaguar club event club events before making a conscious decision to restore it. We truly enjoy the restoration process, and all that goes with it. There were several trips to the British car swap meet and even Hershey with Ian Furness and the Kornelis. We started the mechanical restoration on our 1948 then went the to

cosmetics. Endless business trips to England for Carl helped in getting some parts and details. As we restored the interior, I re-stiched the original leather on the seats, meanwhile I watched Carl layout wiring harnesses. With all those wires and notes, it was the only time I questioned if we were ever going to drive the car again! I have seen a lot come apart in that garage and cars down to the frame...but the spider web of wiring harnesses did leave me a little concerned.

In 2016 we shipped our MK IV to Lexington KY so we could participate in **CCCA** a CARavan and over a 7-day period, we put over 1000 miles on the car traveling lovely KY scenery and back roads. last couple of days we experienced a tremendous amount of rain and when the car came back to us, it took days to dry out the interior (it rained so hard, water had come through the wooden up floorboards).

I said earlier that meeting Jerry and Kathy would change and enrich our lives and I meant it. How many people can say they logged thousands of miles in a D-Type Jaguar? Jerry and Kathy participated annually in a week long C and D Type Jaguar rally in Arizona and for four years, Carl and I had the pleasure of joining them, racing through the hills in northern

Arizona, spending evenings the fireplace after around dinner with stories provided by test driver Norman Jaguar Dewis; definitely life changing experience! We continue to enjoy long lasting friendships with the C & D group. It is actually the friendships we have through vintage cars that have been the greatest treasures to us.



As I type this, Deb Korneli and I just finished making breakfast the morning after the Jaguar Pot Luck event and the four of us are talking about upcoming adventures together!

A foot note regarding the 1934 Bentley that I spoke of in the last chapter. The design company that designed the car was Design Works which was stared be Chuck Pelly. Mr. Pelly also did design work on the famous Scarab race cars. The company still exists and is one of the premier design firms in the world. When I was in their office they had several projects for Japanese motor cycles and auto manufactures.

There were several memorable projects besides the Packard and Cobra that we did when my shop was below Zimdars Motors at Greenfield ave. Being directly across the street from the Fair Grounds race track, and hearing practice was an additional benefit for the small gearhead staff at Classic Auto Works.

Among the above mentioned cars was Jerry Nell's SS 100. Jerry and I went to see the car at George Stauffer's in Bluemounds Wisconsin. It was Primrose Yellow at that time. After Jerry completed the purchase my son David picked up the car and drove it to my house. Jerry also had an E-Type at the time which I sold for him.

After owning the car for a while Jerry brought the SS100 to my shop for restoration. While we started the car at the Greenfield Ave. shop, it was finished at the next location on North Ave. I will discuss the details of that part of the project in chapter 9.

On Greenfield Ave we were blessed with the following vehicles which were either restored or repaired. Three very rare Bizzarini's (out of only about 50), a Figone et'Falachi Talbot Lago, Rolls-Royce Phantom 5, Citroen DS 19, several Maserati's, Several Vintage Ferrari's.

Another bonus of being below Zimdars was the regular Racer's lunches with racing buddies of Harold Zimdars. We frequented a Greek restaurant on Hwy 100, The Greek wine flowed freely. We still meet about once a month, but the group gets smaller and smaller as our age gets greater and greater. Obviously the conversation tends to be racing lore of old.

Chapter 9 will include the SS100 restoration, converting Grey Market Mercedes to US Specs, and possibly Cutting Rolls-Royce Silver Shadows in half.

#### Notes from the Shop

April 2019

Good news, my son Dean has chosen to return to working with me, and I have another chap, Guy who works twenty hours a week. Guy is a retired Milwaukee Fire Dept. mechanic who has a Triumph Spitfire which he restored. So we can make faster progress on the ongoing projects.

Speaking of the projects, the Alloy 120 engine has evolved from a simple head gasket to a complete tear down inspection. It was rebuilt (?) about seventeen years ago, but only ran a few minutes during the years. We found too many very questionable issues to risk putting the milled head back on and running the engine. Be careful when you have major engine rebuilding done by wellmeaning but inexperienced shops. Here is the list of issues on a supposedly rebuilt engine. Head warped .006 inches, some valves too tight and some too loose, upper timing chain too tight, oil galley plug in front of the engine missing, no oil delivery to the lower timing chain sprocket, oil pump gears pitted, flywheel installed 180 degrees off. We have yet to inspect rotating parts.

I am grateful that there are still a few engine shops that have been in the trade for many years.

The Series I cylinder head was done at Rick Bunkfeld's shop. He has one of the finest most respected vintage Ferrari engine shops in the country. He usually does not take any engines other than Ferrari, but I caught him at a slow moment and we have been friends for about 35 years. The short block

is being done at NVR Racing who Rick recommended since he did not have time to do the block. Tom at NVR has been in the racing engine rebuilding trade for a long time.

Other ongoing projects are the 2 + 2 which nears completion, a Series I for suspension rebushing, and A 1962 Rollsfor some routine Royce maintenance. With the additional help we will be able to get to those who have been patiently waiting.

On another note; For those who are unfamiliar with the group called The North Lakeshore Drive 100 MPH club, I encourage you to Google them. Two meetings and car shows a year. With dinner, no dues, no officers. Recent speakers were Ari Luyendeck, Dana Mecum of Mecum auctions, and an event at Real Time Racing. Get on the email list.


